Congratulations to Michelle Woolf!

Congratulations to Michelle Woolf who has been appointed by International Gymnastics Federation - FIG as a Difficulty (D) judge for the Antwerp 2023 Artistic Gymnastics World Championships. D judges are appointed by FIG from the category 1 judges. Only the top 24 judges in the world are category 1 and are deemed the expert judges by the International Federation. There are only 8 D judges appointed to the world championships!





On July 5th - 8th, our WAG and MAG gymnasts representing Wellington, made their way to Tauranaga to compete in the New Zealand Gymnastics Championships.

All our gymnasts had fantastic results! The teams could not have achieved what they did without all the coaches, chaperones, parents, committee, managers, recorders and the support of other gymnasts. Going to Nationals is a BIG achievement and everyone should be proud of themselves.

In the MAG space, it was Caleb and Remy's first time competing at Nationals and both qualified in the top 20 All Around competition. Fraser competed in Level 5 with a huge second day moving up 5 placings.

Jimmy competed for the first time in level 7 against gymnasts twice the size of him, Henry showed everyone how good his pommel is and won the gold!

Elijah took out the u17 All Around National title and Logan had a mammoth apparatus day taking home four gold medals! Also congratulations to Caleb, Elijah and Logan who all achieved proficiency at Nationals.

Level 4 Caleb 63.650, U17 Elijah 68.850, U18 Logan 69.650. Logan also received a coach's medal for being Caleb's coach!

Our club continues to go from strength to strength as we broke a record and had 20 WAG gymnasts from the Step 5-8 teams qualify to go to Nationals. These girls also took home the most medals ever! It is fair to say that Hutt Valley Gymnastics now has a reputation for being one of the strongest, most successful, and biggest senior WAG programmes in the country.

The Step 5 and Step 8 WAG teams took home the Bronze team medal and the Step 7 team were National Champions having won Gold for Wellington. This was particularly impressive given there were large fields in most steps this year with the Step 7s having to qualify and being limited to 75 girls for the first time in recent years. A number of the girls also put in fantastic individual performances resulting in high overall placings and a number of apparatus placings.

The Step 7 team also took home the new Step 7 trophy which was awarded for the first time this year.

Thank you to WAG coaches Nats Gunn and Julia Hardwick-Smith from Hutt Valley and Scott from Capital/Hutt Valley who accompanied our Nationals Gymnasts and took them around for their events.

Nationals will next take place in Palmerston North in October 2024.

Hey everyone! As many of you may know I am currently studying in Denmark through a scholarship I got from Gymnastics NZ! The school I am at is called Ollerup Gymnastikhøjskolen and is a couple of hours out of Copenhagen on the island of Fyn.

I spent a couple of weeks travelling with another kiwi and we just finished our first month of classes here. Everyday is very busy. We need to be at breakfast at 7 and the day doesn't really stop till you go to bed. Classes finish around 4:30 but we are always doing something. At the moment it is summer so we spend a lot of time by the pool and exploring, but there are also many hours spent in the tumbling and fitness centres. We work hard but there is a lot of fun in between.

The year is split up into 2 semesters which means I can choose 2 main focuses. This semester I am doing Health and Fitness, which is similar to sport science. I really enjoy the mix of theory and the practical they have in these classes. Some of the topics we have been covering for example are anatomy, powerlifting, injury prevention, periodisation and movement patterns. Next semester, which begins next year, I will get to move into Tumbling which I am really excited for as the facilities here are so amazing and there are so many awesome athletes to train with.

The international aspect of the school is crazy. I knew it would be diverse but it is almost 50% international students this semester. Some of the closest friends I have made so far are from countries such as Norway, Argentina, Czechia and Australia. It's very entertaining hearing all the different languages but also the different versions of English. Us kiwis here get a hard time sometimes with our accents though which is quite funny!



The way that the Scandinavian countries train and their approach gymnastics is quite different. Gymnastics is a very big part of their sporting culture however their focus is mainly on teamgym and performance gymnastics. This is quite different to NZ where we have our focus of artistic and have struggles to fully develop anything else to the same level. It is awesome to see everything through a new lens. Especially the way that so many people of all ages participate and the focus is on the movement value and community aspect more than competing.

So much has been crammed into the month we have been here. So far we have gone on a camping trip, watched a huge gym competition called face-off, had a circus performance and workshop and attended a concert. Next week we spend a week in Copenhagen, then I believe the rest of the planned trips are to the Czech Republic, Germany then a ski trip to Norway next year!

Being so far from home is a bit hard sometimes but I am having so much fun and learning lots. Missing you all, Lots of love Olive




Coach Spotlight

We are having another GFA Festival in December date to be confirmed.












Our 3 teams, Sparks, Ember & Flare rocked it at their first competition of the year at Te Rauparaha Arena. We are so proud of these hardworking girls!
